#### LEAVES FROM THE LIBRARY

**2,196** records—this is the number of books and other records imported to the online library catalog at the end of April, thanks to Will Hanson. The old records had missing details, such as a lack of subject headings. This missing information can limit results from the search engine and leave users emptyhanded, so our priority this summer and beyond will be data additions and corrections.

#### DANISH LANGUAGE FOR BEGINNERS I

#### TRANSLATION SERVICE AT DAC

The DAC frequently receives requests for translators of documents. We are now offering a translation service. To request a translation, you can mail the materials to the DAC, or email dainfo@dac.mn. Please send a clear copy. Do not send any original documents. DAC cannot be responsible for original documents. Documents can be sent via a picture file, a scanned document, or a Word file. The documents will be reviewed, and the translators will determine if it is material that can be translated. Work will be returned by email. The rate is \$30 per hour for members and \$40 per hour for non-members. Payments can be made by check to the Danish American Center. Translated documents will be returned to you by email. #### **NEW AT DAC**

We are so happy that activity levels at the DAC are high with member guest room and event space rentals keeping us increasingly busy. Along with the recent reinstatement of our Hall Rental Permit we have reviewed our business practices and after over six years of no rate increases, we have made some adjustments to our rates and policies.

We have not increased the guest room rates, but there are no discounts applied until after 30 days for long-term rentals. We also can no longer offer parking for guests who are not in the DAC building. We are happy to have so many events every week, but many of you may have noticed when you come to DAC our parking lot is full. In the past members left their cars as they flew out for trips, but this is no longer possible, so please plan accordingly. And if you bring your bicycle, please plan to lock it up outside the building as we do not have bicycle storage inside the building.

When you make your guest room request, please do not assume we have availability as we could be completely sold out. It is also difficult to honor your requests for guest rooms less than a week in advance.

We have simplified the event space rates for private events. Going forward each space has a set price and there are four base price levels \$25, \$50, \$75 and \$125 for the first two hours of your event: and each additional hour, regardless of the space is \$10 per hour. We have dropped the kitchen rate to \$25 for the first two hours and \$10 for each additional hour. For those of you who have rented in the past, you will see a modest increase of 10-12%. Our rates are still far below the market rate.

If you have any questions, call the office. We will be reaching out to all of the organization level members who present programs regularly to book into next year and will work with you to meet your needs within the new guidelines of the Hall Rental Permit and the new rate chart. And please note that individuals must have an active membership for one full year to be eligible to rent event spaces or guest rooms. Thank you, members, for all of your support to make the DAC flourish.

## THE DANEBO READING CIRCLE IS ON SUMMER BREAK - BUT LOOKING FORWARD TO THE FALL

June will find members enjoying Danish Day and the start of a three-month hiatus. They will undoubtedly be using this time to relax, rejuvenate, read, and revel in summer at home or away. Surely, they will also be finalizing their nominations for 2025 (see the May *DANews* for details). Those are due by September 1, so that deliberation can begin at that month's meeting.

On Sunday, September 15, Carol Sime will lead the group in discussing *The End of Drum-Time: A Novel* by Hanna Pylväinen (USA, 2023: Holt, 349 pages), set above the Arctic Circle in 1850s Sweden. Due to the time of the DAC Annual Meeting, 3-5 PM on the same day, the Reading Circle will begin one hour earlier. The hybrid meeting (Third Floor North Commons and Zoom) will begin at 1 PM and end no later than 3 PM.

Carol shares these thoughts about this acclaimed novel (a finalist for last year's National Book Award): "In September we will return to the Arctic region we visited in March when we explore *The End of Drum-Time* by Hanna Pylväinen. The author writes this character-driven novel with rich detail after intensive research of the Sámi life and the daily rhythms of the Sámi during migration season. Her storytelling gives us different perspectives of the clash of cultures and the unraveling of a community. Set in 1851, the novel is loosely based on the founder of the Læstadius evangelical movement, Lars Lasse ("Mad Lasse") Læstadius." Look for more about this fascinating book in the September newsletter.

To plan ahead and use summertime for sampling the other remaining titles for 2024, please check out the October and November selections: *The Far Traveler: Voyages of a Viking Woman* by British author Nancy Marie Brown (UK, 2007: Harcourt, 306 pages); and *Olav Audunssøn III: Crossroads* by Sigrid Undset (NO, 1925, translated 2022 by Tiina Nunnally: University of Minnesota Press, 242 pages). Happy reading!



The American-Scandinavian Foundation (ASF) is accepting applications for its 44th annual competition for outstanding translations of poetry, fiction, drama, or literary prose written by a 20th- or 21st-century author from the Nordic region (Denmark, Faroe Islands, Greenland, Iceland, Finland, Norway, Sweden, and Sápmi). Among the four prizes to be awarded this year is the Inger and Iens Bruun Translation Prize, supported by Scan Design Foundation, which recognizes the best Danish translation and includes a \$2,000 award. All four prize recipients will also have an excerpt of their translations published in Scandinavian Review and will receive a commemorative bronze medallion.
