DENMARK IN THE 2024 OLYMPICS

Denmark won two gold medals, two silver, and five bronze at the Paris Olympics. Victor Axelsen won gold in badminton and the men's handball team won gold. In terms of medals per capita, i.e. medals related to size of populations (a more noteworthy and justifiable assessment of country medals), Denmark ranked fourteenth.

The forthcoming season at Minnesota Orchestra will be the second led by Music Director Thomas Søndergård, and reflects his expertise across a range of orchestral and operatic repertoire, reflecting his unique perspective as a conductor as well as his many priorities for his tenure as music director. In January 2025, the Danish conductor will bring the inaugural Nordic Soundscapes festival to Orchestra Hall, with two weeks of programming showcasing the contributions of historic and contemporary composers from Nordic nations. DANE OF THE YEAR 2024: SVEA ERNST

This year's Dane of the Year truly helps us put the "Danish" in "Danish American Center." She has cooked many delicious meals for us as a caterer for holiday dinners, but she is also a great volunteer. She helps with at least four Wednesday luncheons (Onsdag Frokost) a year and her menus are always traditional Danish foods. It would not be Christmas without her flæskesteg and risalamande. She has made fancy open-faced sandwiches for the sandwich auction at past Danish Days and open-faced sandwiches for Onsdag Frokost. The underlying theme of much of her work is food.... delicious and traditional Danish food. She started as a baker and with her husband ran Blackey's, a renowned bakery in NE Minneapolis, for years. When she retired, she shared her recipes with Denny's Bakery in Bloomington so we can still buy Kringle and Danish rye bread.... staples at the Danish American Center. She is also a big part of the fall fundraising Cheese Sale making leverpostej, asier, and mahjonger cookies. In an emergency, she is only a phone call away, which she proved, when a caterer got sick in the middle of a wedding party, and Svea saved the day. There is more to this nominee than food, though. Her involvement with the community goes back to Festival of Nation Days where she worked many hours. She is also a prolific knitter and participates in the fall art fair every November selling hand-knit children's sweaters. Two years ago, she knit a Danish pattern cozy for the Danish Holiday room at the American Swedish Institute to give the display a handcrafted design touch. Whenever asked, she steps up and creates food and handcrafts with her special Danish touch.

MUSIC ON THE MISSISSIPPI

Music on the Mississippi May concert featured world-renowned pianist David Hazeltine for a wonderful evening of music in May before a sold-out audience at the Danish American Center. David is considered one of the greatest and most accomplished living pianists in the world. Hazeltine has performed on more albums than anyone in the music business. His trio included one of Minnesota's finest female vocalists, Lucia Newell. She sang beautifully in many different styles and genres. On acoustic bass, was the incredible Billy Peterson. For those who don't know Billy, he has performed at several "Music on the Mississippi" concerts and is considered one of, if not the top, bassists of the last fifty years. Think of the most famous musicians and Billy has performed with all of them from Steve Miller to Bob Dylan. Billy is also a member of DAC and has contributed to the success of "Music on the Mississippi." It was a beautiful night of music in May at the Danish American Center. More shows are coming as we go into our third year of "Music on the Mississippi".



THE DANEBO READING CIRCLE

Sunday, September 15: 1-3pm

On Sunday, September 15, the Danebo Reading Circle will start down the 2024 homestretch. Due to the time of the DAC Annual Meeting, 3-5pm on the same day, the Reading Circle will begin one hour earlier than usual. The hybrid meeting (Third Floor North Commons and Zoom) will begin at 1pm and end no later than 3pm.

In September, Carol Sime will lead the group in discussing *The End of Drum-Time: A Novel* by Hanna Pylväinen (USA, 2023: Holt, 349 pages), a finalist for last year's National Book Award. Carol offers these reflections on the book:

"Set in 1851 in the Arctic region of northern Scandinavia, the novel introduces us to Lars Levi Laestadius, founder of the Laestadian movement, an obscure, strict Lutheran sect. The pastor tries in vain to turn his congregation of Swedes, Finns, and reindeer herders away from alcohol. His daughter, Willa, becomes involved with Ivvár, a reindeer herder who is responsible for his family's diminishing herd. Her pursuit of love sends her on the perilous reindeer migration to the sea.

"Much of the basis of the book - the minister and his efforts to convert the Sámi and change their way of life—is factual. But Pylväinen provides rich detail and storytelling to make the era easier to imagine. As the Swedish settlers moved northward, they introduced what they considered to be necessities—roads, a church, a general store, and buying on credit—to the tundra. The Sámi did not need such systems because natural conditions determined their lives. As the proverb says, 'Let the reindeer decide.'

"Beautifully written and masterfully researched, the book's greatest triumph is the assortment of characters. Pylväinen, having been raised in the Laestadian church and also having stayed with Sámi reindeer herders six times in ten years, moves among different cultures and beliefs with great skill.

"Kirkus Reviews described it as 'ambitious and resonant, a vivid, fascinating, and moving novel.'"

On Sunday, October 20, Barb H Andersen will lead the group in discussing *The Far Traveler: Voyages of a Viking Woman*, by Nancy Marie Brown (USA, 2007: Harcourt, 306 pages). To pique interest in this Nordic biography, Barb writes:

"Gudrid is named in the Viking Sagas and her son Snorri was very likely the first European child born on North American

soil, circa 1005. This history covers aspects of religion, economics, gender relations, values, and world views. The author reteaches us history using a map that covers eastern Canada to Rome, notes on the language, and a prologue putting herself in the shoes of Gudrid, the Far-Traveler. Her research includes experimental archaeology of Viking ship replicas and fabric production. In 2005 she joined a cutting-edge archaeological excavation in Iceland where the sagas say Gudrid finally made her home.

The remaining book for 2024 is *Olav Audunsson III: Crossroads* by Sigrid Undset (NO, 1925, translated 2022 by Tiina Nunnally: University of Minnesota Press, 242 pages). Mary Beth Lake will lead the discussion on Sunday, November 17.

Mary Beth is also compiling nominations for books to read in 2025. The deadline is September 4, so that deliberation can begin at that month's meeting. Please submit as much information as possible (title, author, publisher, translator, dates, pages, availability, brief description) via email by the deadline.

2024 CANDIDATES FOR THE DAC BOARD OF DIRECTORS:

Dana Bacon

Dana lives in Rosemount and is married to DAC Danish instructor Michelle Potter-Bacon. Although his undergrad degree focused on Swedish, he has Danish ancestors via Bornholm. His volunteer board experience includes three years serving on the Hale Page Diamond Lake community board and three years serving on his local elementary PTA board, both times performing multiple officer roles. He works as a senior director in state government affairs for The Leukemia and Lymphoma Society and also has a master's degree in public administration from Hamline University.

John"EJ" Gurley

EJ is currently serving as Vice President of the DAC after being appointed in 2023 to fill a vacancy on the Board. He is seeking a full term. EJ previously served on the DAC Board from 2014 to 2017. He is the son of a Danish mother and attended Skovsøen from 1982-1984.

Susan spent her professional career administering studio art and art history educational programs for public audiences for all ages and retired from the Minneapolis Institute of Art. For ten years she served as a board member of an international museum organization, the French Regional American Museum Exchange. She is English Recording Secretary for Yukimakai, the Japanese Tea Study Group associated with Urasenke, Kyoto, Japan. Susan has been active in the Danish American community for many years serving on the Danebo Inc. board when it joined with the Danish American Fellowship to form the DAC from 2005 on and as DAC President from 2014-2017, Secretary of the board 2011 & 2013-2014 and 2022 to the

present. Susan was selected Dane of the Year 2017. She served on the board of the Danish American Heritage Society from 2006-2009 and was the Minneapolis conference chair in 2009. A Virkylist member, she presents talks on Danish Art to Virkylist members regularly.

She returned to the board in 2021 and wrote a grant receiving legacy funds from the State of Minnesota to establish a collection management system. Susan is currently working in the office helping to transition DAC to professional paid staff. She would like to continue her service running for a second three year term and is looking forward to working on Danish cultural programs in the coming year.

Ginny Kirkegaard Leppart

Ginny's Danish background has allowed her to spend lots of time throughout her life becoming involved in activities at Danebo and St. Peder's Church. Her grandparents, Peter & Ingeborg Kirkegaard, were very active in the Danish community in Minneapolis. Her grandfather has been featured in the exhibits at DAC as the conductor of the Danish men's chorus, and her grandmother was their accompanist. Her grandmother was also a charter member of Virkelyst and a resident of Danebo for a time. Her parents, Rolf & Soli, very much enjoyed all the Danish-related activities offered here and were board members themselves. Her mother was especially involved in Virkelyst. When Ginny retired from elementary school teaching in 2012 it was the perfect time to become more involved herself. She joined Virkelyst and started volunteering with the æbleskive breakfast crew. Since that time, she has been active with the heritage committee.

Ginny was born in Minneapolis, raised in Richfield, and now lives in Eden Prairie. She and her husband Jerry have two grown children. They spend time in Florida off and on throughout the winter and have a cabin in Wisconsin. She really enjoys the DAC and especially the people she meets here.
