In this workshop, you will cut

out the boards and covers for your book, make some tiny pages to glue inside, and put the whole thing together, This work does require a degree of skill, so the workshop is suitable for teens through adults.

MAKE A BOOK SNAKE

Saturday, January 18: 1-3pm
Do you know readers who don't always
want to hold their book open while
reading? Solve the problem of the
closing book and keep your books open
with a Book Snake!



A book snake is a fabric tube that is weighted. You can spread the weight along the snake's body or slide it all down to one end, wherever it is needed to prevent a book from closing while it's being read.

You will hand-sew or machine sew the fabric tube to make the body, then fill and decorate it with button eyes and a V-tongue if you wish. I will have a variety of fabrics, felt, button eyes, and other decorative options. Basic sewing skills, such as backstitch, needed.

THE DANEBO READING CIRCLE PLANS AHEAD FOR 2025

October 19: *The Old Man and His Sons* a Novel by Heðin Brú (Faroes); 1940,166 pp; translated by John F. West (NY: Eriksson,1970).

November 16: *Animal Life* a Novel by Auður Ava Ólafsdóttir (IS); 2020, 192 pp; translated by Brian FltzGlbbon (NY: Black Cat, 2022).

Bookmarks with the full schedule are available on the table outside the DAC Library.

In January, discussion leader Diane Greve will guide the group through a well-known Danish novel of psychological suspense. *Borderliners* takes place in a sealed-off Danish boarding school in the 1970s. Three students discover that the school is using them in a government-sponsored experiment that, almost inevitably, has tragic consequences. The three "misfits" turn the tables by conducting an experiment of their own. Perfect reading for the dark days of winter.

Current, former, and new members are always welcome to meet with the group on the third floor of the DAC or via Zoom. Newcomers may attend the first meeting without commitment, but continuation requires DAC membership.
