DANISH BEGINNERS 2

Prerequisite Danish Beginners 1, a language course using the textbook *Colloquial Danish* for adult learners. We cover core basic language skills in everyday scenarios with plenty of grammar lessons and opportunities to practice with audio and written assignments in the textbook, and hands-on group work in class.

The course meets for ten sessions at the Danish American Center with optional Zoom 'office hour' sessions where students may check in with questions about the lesson or homework assignment. Google Classroom is used for communication and classwork.

LEAVES FROM THE LIBRARY

Who was Tove Ditlevsen?

Tove Ditlevsen has been "rediscovered" following the English translation of her three-volume memoir, *The Copenhagen Trilogy: Childhood, Youth, Dependency*, which was named one of the *NY Times* 10 best books of 2021.



Ditlevsen was born on December 14, 1917, in Copenhagen, and grew up in the poor, working-class district of Vesterbro. Her father told her, "Girls can't be poets."

She was unable to continue her education past age 14 and had to work. Yet by her early 20s, her poems were published, and she was a renowned poet.

Ditlevsen's tumultuous life: four marriages, an illegal abortion, three children plus one adopted. Husband #3 nearly killed her with increasing doses of Demerol: he liked passive women. She became addicted and struggled with this and depression for the rest of her life. She died by suicide in 1976.

Ditlevsen was enormously popular during her lifetime, and her books sold well. They were in the reading curriculum of many Danish schools, [yet] her work was often disregarded by the literary establishment, being considered "women's books." Her work was not included in the official Danish literary canon until 2014.

Most literary critics agree: Ditlevsen was a brilliant writer. Below are attributes gleaned from just a few critics' published reviews of Ditlevsen's work.

Nina Siegal, *New York Times* Jan 7, 2023: concise, terse, energy, vulnerability, courage, stunning clarity, humor, candidness, raw, way ahead of the curve, unflinching honesty, artistic transformation of pain into hope.

Megan O'Grady, *New York Times Book Review*, Jan 26, 2021: immediacy, vitality, rueful honesty, bracing lack of vanity, tenderly wrapped horror, extraordinary clarity, imperfect feminist, diffident, funny.

Marie Solis, *The Nation* May 6, 2021: taut, lucid, composed, resists the conventions, beautiful Danish literature translator Michael Favala Goldman: "...after reading the last page [of volume 3 in Danish] ...it occurred to me that I had just read a masterpiece." Goldman subsequently translated the book, *Dependency*, and the Trilogy came together.

The DAC library has several Danish and English versions of Ditlevsen's books. I encourage you to rediscover Tove Ditlevsen for yourself.

February 15 The Fish Can Sing (Brekkukotsannáll), a novel by Halldór Laxness (IS); 1957, 288 pages; translated into English by Magnús Magnússon (ã1966) for Havrill Press, 2000.

March 15 The Greenlanders, an historical fiction novel by Jane Smiley (US); 1988, 558 pages.

April 19 On the Calculation of Volume (Om Udregning af Rumfang), a novel by Solvej Balle (DK); 2020, 161 pages; translated by Barbara Haveland for publication in English in 2024.

May 17 The Dangerous Age (Den farlige Adler), a novel by Karin Michelaëlis (DK); 1910, 104 pages; translated into English by Beatrice Marshall in 1912; published in digital format by Project Gutenberg in 2004.

September 20 The Sisters (Systrarna), a novel by Jonas Hassen Khemiri (SE); 2023, 638 pages; translated by the author for publication in English in 2025.

October 18 Wolf Hour (Minnesota), a mystery novel by Jo Nesbø (NO); 2025, 400 pages; translated by Robert Ferguson for publication in English in February 2026.

November 15 The Keeper of Lost Causes (Kvinden i Buret), the first Department Q mystery by Jussi Adler-Olsen (DK); 2007, 417 pages; translated into English by Lisa Hartford for publication in the UK (Mercy) in 2011; current paperback edition, 2012.
