## NOTES FROM THE PRESIDENT

We have made progress this year! At the most recent board meeting, we spent a good deal of time reviewing the challenges and successes of the past year. I'm extremely happy with how things have played out over the course of the past 12 months, and our successes are numerous.



The board spent a significant amount of time doing a thorough recap of the past year. We've examined everything from the financials, to our events of the past year, to our investments in improving our facilities and building. We have made some really nice strides, and I feel like the DAC is continuing on a very stable, exciting path for the future.

Here's a brief recap:

Our major annual events have been very successful. The Julefrokost, Akvavit Pairing Meal, Danish Day, music events, and our Æbleskive Breakfasts have all been performing very well. We have made some significant improvements to the property. There has been a small cost here, as the water leak that occurred last spring forced us to do some significant cleanup and repairs. We've also had a few other significant repairs to the building, but we are doing what is necessary to keep the facility humming along.

Our facility staffing has been terrific. Kate and Tina, our office administrator and caretaker, respectively, have done a fantastic job this year. We are grateful for the stability they provide to the organization on a day-to-day basis.

Our board members have been active in all facets of operation of the DAC. We have been able to successfully orchestrate these events and coordinate the finances, and our organization remains on a solid footing as we look forward to planning for 2027.

## DANEBO READING CIRCLE BEGINS THREE-BOOK AUTUMN SCHEDULE

Sunday, September 20: 1-3pm

The remaining three meetings of the year begin with a Swedish novel. Discussion leader Marie Thorsten will greet new and returning members on the third floor of the DAC, welcoming others to the hybrid meeting via Zoom. Treats are usually available with beverages from the earlier Æbleskive Breakfast. Everyone is welcome!

***The Sisters (Systrarna)***, a novel by Jonas Hassen Khemiri (SE); 2023, 638 pages; translated by the author for publication in English in 2025 (New York: Farrar, Straus and Giroux). The author has published six novels, seven plays, and a collection of short stories and essays. He lives in Brooklyn with his family and teaches creative writing at New York University.

Narrated from afar by Jonas, a neighborhood, childhood friend, this is the story of the three Mikkola sisters that unfolds in six "books" and 137 chapters over three-and-a-half decades. Each part covers a different length of time – from the first year of the new millennium to a single minute in the year 2035. It takes place mainly in Stockholm and New York.

Fellow Nordic author Fredrik Backman describes *The Sisters* as "a thoroughly fascinating story about sibling rivalry, loyalty, and love, a story that is about the microcosm of the family as much as it is about the bigger world. Jonas Hassen Khemiri is the very rare combination of a deep intellectual and a true story-teller, as smart as he is entertaining." Other reviewers, quoted on the cover, call it a "novel of unsurpassed tenderness" (Katie Kitamura) and "Captivating and so full of life – one of those books you live inside and miss when it's over." (Isabella Hammad). She also comments that it's "about being Arab in Sweden and Swedish in Tunisia". Author Madeleine Thien names this "Khemiri's masterpiece, a beautiful double helix of memory and imagination.... Life overflows its pages."

On Sunday, October 18, the Reading Circle will discuss ***Wolf Hour (Minnesota)***, a mystery novel by Jo Nesbø (NO); 2025, 400 pages; translated by Robert Ferguson for publication in English in February 2026 (New York: Knopf), led by Carol Sime. The book was "discovered" in an Oslo bookstore by a member in 2024.

Carol comments that "Our usual practice has been to exclude the very popular Nordic Noir genre, but it was too hard to resist a book set in Minnesota, mostly Minneapolis, by Norway's most successful author to date. Nesbø books have sold over 50 million copies worldwide.

"Although the main character of *Wolf Hour* is not Nesbø's antihero Harry Hole, the narrator of this novel is himself a crime writer. The themes of grief, trauma and revenge, and the dark procedural structure will be familiar to Nesbø readers. Non-fans of this genre may still be entertained by this foreigner's impressions of our cities' major sites and landmarks."

## DANE OF THE YEAR 2026: GINNY LEPPART

Our Dane of the Year for 2026 has been an active volunteer at DAC for many years and she has deep roots in the community. When she retired from teaching in 2012, she took

the opportunity to become more involved. She is the third generation in her family to give volunteer service at Danebo, the Danish American Fellowship and now the Danish American Center. Her grandmother even lived at Danebo for a time. Her parents Rolf & Soli Kirkegaard both served on the board and she has followed their tradition of board service beginning in 2022.

Ginny is head of the DAC Archive project and has been organizing, researching and caring for our historic documents as part of the Heritage Committee. In the past three years she has catalogued over 150 documents that now can be searched from our online catalog. This includes measuring, writing descriptions, photographing or scanning the objects, labelling with accession numbers, preparing for storage using archival materials, recording location, and uploading to the database [MnCollections.org](https://mncollections.org), our collection website. She makes our history accessible to the public. The first objects she entered when we started online were old Danebo Home newsletters so people could find a record of their family member's involvement going back to 1924.

Before the catalog project she helped organize exhibitions about our history and wrote articles, including about her grandparents Peter & Ingeborg Kirkegaard who were very active in the Danish community. Her grandfather Peter has been featured in exhibits here as the conductor of the Danish men's chorus. Her grandmother was their accompanist.



Her grandmother, Ingeborg Kirkegaard, was a charter member of Virkelyst. Ginny is now the President and organizer of this activity group, sending meeting notices, making meeting arrangements and serving as MC at the Virkelyst Julefrokost luncheon. For years, she has regularly volunteered at many of the æbleskive breakfasts, often with her husband, setting tables, serving, and cleaning up for the hundreds of people who come to the nine breakfasts we offer a year, one of our biggest fundraisers. She organized Open Doors for several years when we participated in that community effort. Every time we have a call for volunteers she steps up as a willing volunteer for so many events ...Danish Day, Julefrokost, clean up day... and she is volunteering today. And volunteering with her daughter carrying the tradition to four generations. Two of her most endearing qualities are her optimism and generosity of spirit. She is always the first to congratulate others and see the bright side in any situation. Please join us in honoring Ginny Leppart, Dane of the Year 2026!
